Leon County Teen Court Program

This is a system of court proceedings for first time juvenile offenders where teenage students preside as officers of the court to conduct the hearing and sentencing. High school students volunteer to act as lawyers, bailiffs, clerks and jurors. The only adult involved in the hearing is the judge. The defendant is sentenced according to the judgement of the teen court jury.

The Legal Aid Foundation of the Tallahassee Bar Association

The Legal Aid Foundation provides direct legal services to indigent citizens of Leon County. All legal services are provided voluntarily by members of the Tallahassee Bar Association (TBA), as well as non-TBA attorneys, who wish to provide volunteer legal services. These attorneys are in both private practice and government service. A different attorney serves in the Legal Aid office each day and will see up to four clients. Appointments are scheduled between 9am - 12 pm or 2 pm-5pm. Additionally, LAF refers clients directly to an attorney's office if the attorney chooses this option, but the LAF staff still provides the intake services and follow-up on each case.
