

MONEY, POLITICS AND THE IRS: WHAT'S THE FUTURE OF YOUR CHARITABLE GIVING?



On Wednesday, April 15 from 6:30pm – 8:00pm at the Augustus B. Turnbull III, Florida State Conference Center, Public Citizen versus The Heritage

Foundation will debate "Money, Politics" and the IRS: What's the Future of Your Charitable Giving?" Controversy abounds over the use of so-called "dark money" by certain nonprofits that under IRS Code can currently engage in lobbying and political activity, but do not have to disclose their donors. However, many have labeled nonprofit giving as Americans' right to **free speech**, citing the importance of donors engaging privately with organizations that multiply their voices in the "public square." Adding to the dispute, after facing a flood of newlyproposed nonprofit organizations filing to gain 501(c)(4) status under IRS Code, the IRS used conservative terms such as "tea party" and "patriot" to flag applicants for extra scrutiny. These revelations and more have heightened the public deliberation over this line in the sand: How should the government regulate nonprofits? You are invited to join The James Madison Institute as they host Public Citizen and The Heritage Foundation in a debate over the future of your charitable giving. Please RSVP. NORTH FLORIDA HOMELESS VETERANS STAND DOWN

You can end Veteran homelessness by December 31, 2015. Military type operations are getting underway which involve hundreds of the area's Veterans, not fighting a war, but combatting life on the streets as a veteran experiencing homelessness. From April 24 to April 26, **2015** the North Florida Fair Grounds will be the host to the North Florida Homeless Veterans Stand Down. In times of war, a stand down has exhausted combat units requiring time to rest and recover, be removed from the battlefields to a place of security and safety. This Stand Down refers to a grassroots, community-based intervention program designed to help the estimated 400-500 homeless Veterans in North Florida. During the 3 day/2 night event, the North Florida Fairgrounds in Tallahassee, FL will take on a military atmosphere as tents and cots are set up for the Veterans who are experiencing homelessness in the Tallahassee area. They will live and sleep on the property throughout the weekend. Veterans who do not have permanent housing will have free access to housing assistance, showers, food, clothing, medical services, legal services, mental health services, and job counseling. Most importantly, though, they will receive companionship and camaraderie. The Stand Down expects an atmosphere of providing dignity and respect. SETH ROSSETTI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006, this memorial scholarship was created in memory of Seth Rossetti. The purpose of this scholarship is to support one undergraduate student who is presently or who was for a significant part of his/her life, the child of a single parent. This scholarship is available to all current FSU undergraduate students with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average and all incoming FSU freshmen with a minimum 3.0 high school cumulative grade point average. Applicants for the award must submit a pictorial collage of at least 10 but no more than 20 photographs/images that will communicate the student's sense of his or her personal identity and how he or she defines the concept of diversity. Collages cannot exceed a size of 15" x 20". The collage will be accompanied by an essay of no more than two to four pages describing the collage in terms of the applicant's personal definition of diversity and explaining their financial need as it relates to your single parent experience. Essays must be typed and submitted using the standard U.S. 8 1/2" x 11" format, double-spaced, in 12-point font (Times New Roman). One winner will receive a \$1000 scholarship (\$500 in Fall 2015 & \$500 in Spring 2016). Submit your materials here by Friday, April 17 by 5:00pm. BEN ROSENBLOOM MEMORIAL SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

The Ben Rosenbloom Memorial Service Scholarship is designed to recognize a student with an outstanding record of service and a commitment to a lifetime of service. Loyal Seminoles, Ben and Wilma Rosenbloom were founding members of the FSU Parents Association. Following their move to Tallahassee in 1991, the Rosenblooms' tireless efforts revived the organization from its latent condition. In order to re-establish the FSU Parents Association, the Rosenblooms attracted hundreds of new members and prompted tens of thousands of dollars in donations. Ben Rosenbloom gave countless hours of service to help students and their families feel at home at Florida State University. His faithful dedication to the education and support of FSU students has become a model of joys and rewards of service. This scholarship was established by the FSU Parents Association in deep appreciation for his exemplary service to FSU. Who is Eligible to Apply? Any rising sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate full-time student who will be returning to FSU for the 2015-2016 academic year with a minimum of 2.0 GPA is eligible to apply.
