Get Re-Recognized or Start a New RSO over the summer! All Recognized Student Organizations (RSOs) must Re-Recognize each year with the Student Activities Center (SAC) to remain active at FSU. This process is open from now through September 30. However, SAC **HIGHLY** encourages you to get your recognition application and materials in as soon as possible. Recognition is easy – just follow these three main steps:

1. Review the Online Workshop & take the [Recognition Quiz](#) online
2. Complete the online recognition application through [Nole Central](#). *Click the **Register this Organization** button underneath your RSO in the Organizations tab
3. Submit the last page of the Signature Packet, signed by the RSO President and Advisor to the Student Activities Center.*The signature packet is available to download during the last step of your Nole Central online application. Make sure to download the packet before you submit your online application.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY POSITION: CENTER OPERATIONS STUDENT ASSISTANT

This position is funded by the Federal Work-Study Program.

Please make sure you have been received the Federal Work-Study Award prior to applying. There are multiple specialized positions available – receptionist, fleet management assistant, evening staff, and programmatic support staff. Student Assistants are responsible for performing a wide variety of important tasks such as assisting with daily operations, upkeep of the Center, and/or assisting with cluster programs. Student Assistants will have the opportunity to cover the front desk as needed (answering phones and assisting visitors who come in seeking information or services). Students should be able to work 8 to 10 hours per week, Monday through Friday with the willingness to perform a shift during evening hours. Duties include: maintaining the department's fleet of vans (filling up with gas, replenishing forms, data entry of mileage logs, transporting to/from repair shop, etc.); organizing/cleaning spaces in the building (storage closets, work rooms, etc.); research and training related to multiculturalism, identity and diversity awareness; and helping with other special projects. Applicants should have been awarded Federal Work Study through the Office of Financial Aid in order to apply. Diagnosed with cerebral palsy soon after birth, her parents refused to believe that their child could not do anything any other child could do with time and determination. Dr. Mason's career was committed to ensuring that all people were recognized by their *abilities*, rather than their disabilities. Applicants must provide a current transcript with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on all credits. High school students who are applying for the first year of college should submit a current high school transcript. Applicants with a physical disability are eligible.
