OFFICE FOR CIVIL RIGHTS (OCR)


The U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR), is conducting an investigation of our university pursuant to Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1974 (Title IX), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex by colleges and universities that receive Federal funds from the U.S. Department of Education. Title IX requires universities to investigate alleged incidents of sexual harassment or violence if the university knows, or should know, of the alleged discrimination. For more information about OCR and sexual harassment, you may visit the [Department of Education's website](#). As part of its investigation, OCR is interested in hearing about the experiences of Florida State University students with respect to sexual harassment or sexual violence, the University's responsiveness to reports of sexual harassment and violence, and the environment on campus with respect to these issues.

If you are a student and would like to participate with OCR in a group interview on Wednesday, October 22 or Thursday, October 23, 2014, please contact Stephanie Pessin at OCR at (404) 974-9343, or by email at Stephanie.Pessin@ed.gov, no later than 5:00pm on October 20.

The interviews will tentatively occur at 9:00am, 1:00pm, 4:00pm, and 7:00pm on October 22; and 8:00am and 10:00am on October 23. Location to be determined and announced as the interview dates approach. Please note that these student groups are closed to University staff and to the media. Please note that OCR staff will be available between the group interviews on October 22 and 23 for one-on-one discussions with students, as needed. So please stop by to talk with OCR once a location has been announced. Also, if you would like to share information with OCR outside the context of the on-campus group interviews please contact OCR at the above voicemail or email address. Title IX also prohibits intimidation or retaliation against any person who provides information to OCR as part of an investigation. Please note that although the Freedom of Information Act requires OCR to make its records available to the public upon request, OCR will not release information that would constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy, such as the identity of students who share information with OCR in an investigation. The identities of faculty and staff also would be withheld in most circumstances. Please feel free to contact OCR to discuss any questions you have regarding confidentiality. MULTICULTURAL LEADERSHIP SUMMIT



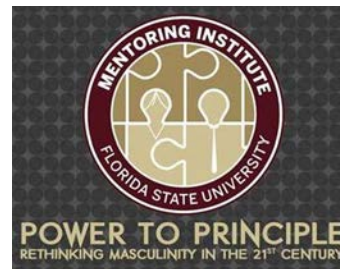

The Multicultural Leadership Summit focuses on a foundation of knowledge that will enhance student success in leadership in the areas of multiculturalism, diversity, and social justice. The goal is to educate students on

diversity and multiculturalism and empower them to be agents of social change in an increasingly diverse and global community. The theme for this year's summit is "Building Alliances for Change: Together We Can _____". For the first time for MLS, FSU is partnering with Florida Agricultural & Mechanical University and Tallahassee Community College to bring together students from each respective campus by attending the 2015 Multicultural Leadership Summit. Mock Interview Mentor



WHAT IS A MOCK INTERVIEW?

The Mock Interview Program is a service for Florida State University students and recent alumni to practice interview skills and receive feedback on their performance. The objective of the program is to provide a quality, professional mock interviewing experience.

WHAT DOES A MOCK INTERVIEW MENTOR (MIM) DO?

Mock Interview Mentors (MIMs) facilitate in-person, phone, or Skype mock interviews for current FSU students and recent alumni. A Mock Interview Mentor will be responsible for:

- Executing 5-7 mock interviews per week for undergraduate students, graduate students, and recent alumni utilizing multiple technology systems.
- Tailoring specific mock interview questions based on submitted resumes and cover letters. Some industries and job functions may require research in order to provide a quality mock interview experience.
- Assisting employers/recruiters during guest employer mock interviews.
- Participating in monthly professional development sessions co-sponsored by local and regional employers.

HOW WOULD THIS EXPERIENCE DEVELOP ME PROFESSIONALLY?

Mock Interview Mentors (MIMs) have the opportunity for in-house professional development through supervision meetings with the Mock Interview Program Coordinator and interview training from Career Center staff, professional recruiters, and hiring managers.

Former MIMs indicate confidence growth in both verbal and nonverbal communication, including the ability to provide constructive feedback, preparing MIMs for future leadership positions.

WHO IS AN IDEAL MIM CANDIDATE?

The ideal Mock Interview Mentor (MIM) candidate will:

- Be in good academic standing with the University.
- Participate in the Experiential Certificate Program OR in an academic internship course.
- Deliver superior customer service for each Mock Interview Program participant.
- Possess critical thinking skills.
- Understand occasional need for troubleshooting technological issues.

HOME FIRE PREPAREDNESS CAMPAIGN

The American Red Cross is hosting a Home Fire Preparedness Campaign: Appalachian Ridge Neighborhood Canvassing Event. Home fires are the greatest disaster threat to American families. Seven people die every day from home fires. A fire-related injury is reported every 40 minutes. Annually, home fires cause 2,500 deaths and roughly \$7 billion in property damage. The Home Fire Preparedness Campaign aims to save lives, reduce injuries and build more resilient communities through raising awareness, facilitating preventative actions, and fostering community participation. The national goal is a 25% reduction in home fire deaths and injuries in the next five years. At-risk neighborhoods in Tallahassee will be targeted and volunteers will go door-to-door providing educational materials and encouraging citizens to test their smoke alarms. In a partnership with the Tallahassee Fire Department and State Fire Marshal, the goal is to reduce the frequency of home fires in the Appalachian Ridge neighborhood. **This event will take place on Monday, October 20, 2014.
